Count Marcelle is a contemporary artist hailing from the underground art scene in San Francisco and well on his way to Madison Avenue. He is breaking new ground with a revolutionary style in the mediums of collage and photography. His work evokes a feeling of organized chaos and his socially charged themes are brimming with hard hitting, urban-chic drama.

With an approach akin to that of Warhol, Linder Sterling, and Jacques Villegle’, yet unique enough to call his own; he weaves together the elements of advertising, fashion, sex, and blatantly subversive political humor to create meaningful visual statements.

The pieces on display in his current art exhibition, "Empire", draw from, and truly reflect, the subconscious memes of our modernized culture. A guttural first impression strikes the viewer as would a bold, black news headline, grabbing their attention and then luring them inside to take a closer look.

Far from precocious, these snapshots and juxtapositions provide a deeper look into contemporary archetypes and reveal an underlying connection between sex, politics, and advertising.

With compositions which are appealing to the eye and immediately recognizable, the pieces in his current body of work signify an intriguing new angle from which to view contemporary art.

All pieces of collage art in his current collection “Empire” are “one of a kind” originals, and are signed and dated by the artist for authenticity.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Images in the photography collection are currently available as photographic prints along with several standard sizing options all of which are suitable for framing. All photographic prints are limited to a series of 100 per image and size.
